CONDUCT AND MANAGEMENT OF THE AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISE

The standard jobs targeted by the agricultural vocational baccalaureate "Conduct and Management of the Agricultural Enterprise" are those of farmers and highly qualified agricultural employees.

In this training, the learner learns to master the production techniques and, according to the chosen orientations, the processing and marketing processes. He also learns about the use of a wide variety of agroequipment, decision support tools (DST) and the mastery of information and communication technologies. As a company manager and as a manager when employing salaried labour, the head of an agricultural enterprise is a versatile and multi-skilled man or woman who must know how to anticipate and adapt in a rapidly changing context. To do so, it must ensure forward-looking monitoring and seek the best practices and techniques available to progress.

- Duration of training: 3 years
- 30 weeks of school education with a student schedule of 28 hours per week

- The training includes 16 weeks of internship
